Pratt Center seeks a Climate Initiatives Graduate Fellow to support our energy & resiliency work. This position is open to students from the Graduate Center for Planning and the Environment. This fellow will work on projects in Pratt Center's climate justice portfolio, including EnergyFit Affordable Small Homes, a demonstration project implementing an equitable clean energy access model for communities in Central and Eastern Brooklyn. The fellow may also support other priorities, such as policy advocacy campaigns and a citywide environmental justice engagement campaign. Work will be focused on supporting outreach and education efforts in the field, data and programmatic analyses, and contributing to written reports in support of our community partnerships and policy priorities.

Fellows at Pratt Center work 14 hours per week under the supervision of a staff member. The work schedule aligns with Pratt Institute's academic calendar; fellows work when school is in session. In 2026-2027, there will be a cohort of four fellows and learning opportunities provided throughout the fellowship year.

**Responsibilities**

- × Support EnergyFit administration including data cleaning and analysis
- × Provide in-the-field outreach for EnergyFit alongside our community based partners
- × Research related to clean energy access with a focus on local, State and Federal policy
- × Participate in campaigns and actions to support climate policy advocacy with our coalition partners
- × Create facilitation guides and support partner organizations in the field during citywide environmental justice engagement meetings

**Skills and Interests**

- × Candidates should have an interest and experience in sustainability, energy efficiency, affordable housing, decarbonization strategies, and/or other climate action.
- × Candidates must be committed to the tenets of energy and environmental justice and focusing on supporting low-income communities in accessing the benefits of clean energy. Must be able to speak to what these issues are.
- × Experience with data analysis using Microsoft Excel. Other data analysis and visualization skills and experience with programs like R, GIS, database management software are a plus.
- × Organized, able to self-manage and turn around work in a timely manner.
- × Strong written and verbal communication skills are required.

**To Apply**

This is a hybrid in-person and remote position. It is a two-semester part-time fellowship at 14 hours/week. Graduate fellows are paid \$4,410 per semester by tuition remission.
